

**SUMMER TEACHING OPPORTUNITY  
COLLEGE CAMP 2006  
JUNE 12-16, 2006**

**ABSTRACT**

College Camp is a one-week, hands-on experience for students entering grades 6-9 in the fall of 2006. Students will choose two sessions and attend one from 8:00-10:00 a.m. and the other from 10:15 a.m.-12:15 p.m. each day. Upon completion of the program, students will have gained hands-on, applied experiences; current career cluster information; and entry-level program and career requirements in two technical areas.

**GOAL**

Career education for students in grades 6-9.

**OUTCOMES**

Hands-on applied experiences in technical areas.

Entry-level program and career requirements for technical careers.

Exposure to a technical college setting.

**APPLICATION FOR COURSE DEVELOPMENT DELIVERY**

Instructors are invited to submit an abstract of a course to be developed and delivered for College Camp based on the above outcomes.

**GUIDELINES**

Course Length: The course will be delivered twice daily; once from 8:00-10:00 a.m. and again from 10:15 a.m.-12:15 p.m. (10 hours of instruction per course).

Delivery: Course must be delivered using a hands-on, applied methodology. Students must be given current entry-level program and career cluster information.

Number of Students: We project a maximum of 25 students per session. If you feel your maximum number of students must be less than 25, please submit your maximum number and the rationale. Course sessions with less than 10 students will be canceled.

Stipends: \$1,000 for new courses; \$800 for existing courses.

1. A detailed course outline (daily lesson plan) listing hands-on, applied learning activities for 10 hours of instruction. (Must have this to comply with our grant guidelines.)
2. A short paragraph describing your course. This is what students/parents will see on the registration form and in marketing pieces for College Camp.
3. A description of the type of room you need to present your course.
4. Current career information and entry-level requirements for your area. You must also include how the career information will be incorporated into your curriculum.
5. A list of materials you will need to present your course (\$400 is allowed). We do not reimburse for student snacks in your classroom.

You will be notified of course approval by March 16, 2006. You will be notified by May 25, 2006 if there is enough enrollment for your course to run.

1. **February 28, 2006—applications due from instructors.**
2. **March 16, 2006—approval of courses.**
3. **May 25, 2006—course offerings finalized (student registration deadline is May 23).**
